### Welding a Vision - Sculptor Rebecca Fox

[Rebecca Fox](#) found her true artistic passion at an early age. Surrounded by the influences of her uncle who was a metal-worker, Rebecca attributes her uncle as one of her main influences growing up. She finds inspiration everyday on her eagerness to work and spends hours upon hours in her Californian gallery welding her imagination together to form steel structures of delight.

To expand her technical knowledge, Rebecca worked for several years as a welder in a custom metal fabrication shop in Oakland, California. During this time, she honed her metal-working skills, which she applies to her art everyday.

Rebecca's work has produced an extensive following of collectors, as her work has been included in over 100 private collections throughout the United States. She has also been featured in the publication by Alcove books titled, American Art Collector Volumes 2 & 3.

The process for each of her one-of-a-kind welded steel sculptures begins as she scours scrap yards and metal shops for pieces with unique shapes, textures and colors. She usually keeps stock piles of material in her studio. Rebecca likes the piles to surround her daily to inspire her. Rebecca never sketches out a single work on paper before she goes to town with her torch. Her creations are a mixture of free standing sculptures and wall sculptures if you find yourself short on room for her gorgeous sculptures. Each piece takes hours to finish and has a modern yet earthy feel. Rebecca Fox's passion for metal welding catapults her to becoming a sought after sculptor and a valued American artist.
